\*Privacy Act Statement: Your social security number is required on a voluntary basis under authority of sections 6041, 6103 and 6109 of the Internal Revenue Code for two purposes. First, if you earn more than \$600 in compensation as a juror, the court must inform the Internal Revenue Service using your social security number, and it is helpful to get your number now. Second, in tax cases involving the United States, a party may the Secretary of the Treasury whether prospective jurors have or have not been the subject of an audit or other tax investigation by the Internal Revenue Service, and the Secretary is limited to giving yes or no response. Providing your social security number makes it much easier to answer that question accurately and quickly. Failure to provide your social security number will not disqualify you from serving as a juror, but it may delay or disrupt the jury selection process.
